Infrastructure Debt –

Infrastructure assets provide essential services and have high barriers to entry. The inelastic demand for these products, which drive our daily lives, create long-term, stable cash flow generation. Today, global infrastructure growth is being driven by durable market trends. There are three key infrastructure themes that are providing strong tailwinds across core infrastructure segments (transportation, utilities, energy and digital):

- Digitalization, deglobalization and decarbonization trends are driving increased demand for capital expenditure to meet these objectives. Increased regulation and focus on emissions reductions, evolving cloud compute & AI training models accelerating demand for digital resources, as well as improving socioeconomic conditions underpin these trends.
- Global infrastructure investment is expected to exceed \$3.7 trillion a year through 2035, with a total gap of \$5.5 trillion over the same period that is expected to be funded by private investors, whether via debt or equity.
- The increase in infrastructure capex, alongside constrained public investment and bank retrenchment has led to a recent supply and demand imbalance for infrastructure equity and debt, creating opportunities for private markets to fill in the gap. As private lenders have become increasingly critical as a source of capital for infrastructure development, the market will continue to provide attractive opportunities for scaled, and experienced infrastructure lenders

Along with market themes and color, this webinar will explore how infrastructure debt complements corporate credit, and how allocations to infrastructure debt can benefit a private credit or infrastructure equity portfolio, creating diversity, reducing volatility and enhancing returns of these portfolios.

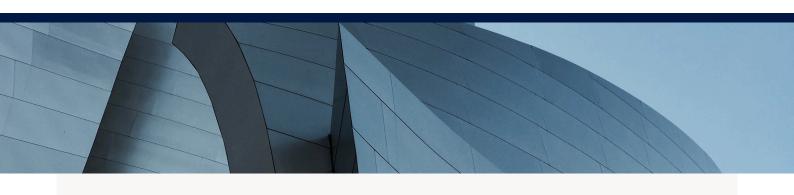
